Making Your Own Print Alphabet Flip Chart

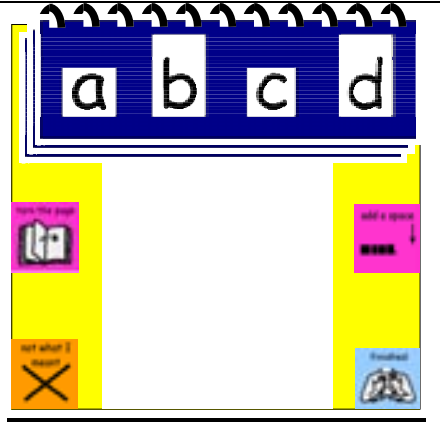
Materials/Equipment Needed:

5-6 File Folders (Can be colored for visual contrast)

Scissors & Glue stick

Laminate or Contact Paper

Comb Binder & Binding Machine



Making the Print Alphabet Flip Chart:

1. Color xerox or print out letter strips and symbols; if printing, set for legal paper in landscape mode.
2. Cut five 4 1/2" x 13" strips of file folder.
Cut one 12" x 13" sheet for back writing page.
3. Center and glue alphabet strips on to file folder strips.
4. Can glue white paper onto back page for writing area.
5. On back page, can add on supplemental symbols.
Glue "turn the page," and "add a space" on separate sides of back page, just below alphabet pages.
Can add "not what I meant" and "finished" to bottom corners.
Glue down white page onto back yellow page (has reminder to attach paper or to Xerox writing).
7. Cover all surfaces with laminate or contact paper
8. Trim laminate or contact paper off of tops of strips and top of back writing page so that comb binder will go through file folder and not plastic. On other sides, be sure to leave ~1/4" of laminate so that edges stay sealed.
9. Punch binding holes and bind!
10. Attach dry erase marker with velcro or string.

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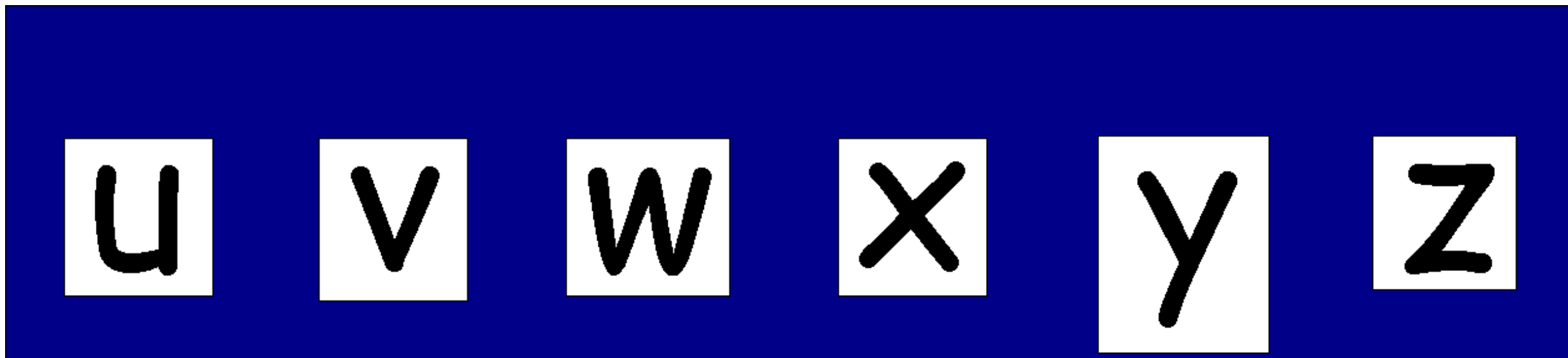
